

Stormwater Management

This item was included in the agenda for the City of Armstrong. The development of homes on the the 54 acres of the Royal York Golf Course land would change the land from an absorbant grassy area with trees to sealed roadways and rooftops. The stormwater would then be piped directly into Meighan Creek and add to the flood waters that affect the neighbouring communities. How the City would manage this excessive amount of additional stormwater when the current volume of water is an ongoing problem for everyone is a major concern. The District of Spallumcheen and the Okanagan Indian Band should express their concerns about this potential development.
